A Message from Pastor Russ

The Cross

We affirm the beauty of God's complete forgiveness that is offered to you through faith in Christ's life, death and resurrection. Sadly, many Christians today look at Cross merely as a "get out of God's eternal jail card". Many miss out that the Cross is also an invitation to a different kind of life.

Jesus certainly died FOR us. We tend to downplay that Jesus also invites us to die WITH Him. The Cross certainly brings us hope of eternal salvation. The Cross also stands in judgment of the values of this world system.

Here are some truths to consider about the Cross:

- The Cross is central to our hope for salvation. Colossians 1: 22 But now he has reconciled you by Christ's physical body through death to present you holy in his sight, without blemish and free from accusation.
- Taking up our cross is essential for following Jesus. Mark 8: 34 Then he called the crowd to him along with his disciples and said: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me."
- Identifying with Christ's crucifixion is central to living the Christian life.

 Galatians 2: **20** I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.
- The Cross repudiates human wisdom and redefines power: I Corinthians 1: 18
 For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

- The Cross is central to Christian ministry: I Corinthians 2: 2 For I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ and him crucified.
- The Cross unifies God's people. Ephesians 2: 15 His purpose was to create in himself one new humanity out of the two, thus making peace, 16 and in one body to reconcile both of them to God through the cross, by which he put to death their hostility.
- Worship in heaven will focus on the Lamb who was slain for us. Revelation 5: 9 And they sang a new song, saying: "You are worthy to take the scroll and to open its seals, because you were slain, and with your blood you purchased for God persons from every tribe and language and people and nation."

Throughout church history, God's people have been enamored with human power and its trappings. But empires fade. Armies are eventually defeated. Governments come and go. Wealth disappears.

The Cross remains.




