Means of Grace: From first to last, the Christian life is a gift. However, Christians have the response-ability to put themselves in the way of God's grace through classic practices such as prayer, learning God's Word, worship, fellowship, etc.

Grace is the transformative power of God to change a human life: Romans 2: 4Don't you see how wonderfully kind, tolerant, and patient God is with you? Does this mean nothing to you? Can't you see that his kindness is intended to turn you from your sin? (New Living Translation)

#### Grace!

## 1<sup>st</sup>) Definition:

At the heart of Wesleyan/Methodist theology and practice is a profound understanding and vital experience of grace. John Wesley defined grace as God's "bounty, or favor: his free, undeserved favor, ... man having no claim to the least of his mercies." The Book of Discipline defines grace as "the undeserved, unmerited, and loving action of God in human existence through the ever-present Holy Spirit." *Source: https://www.resourceumc.org/en/content/a-wesleyan-understanding-of-grace* 

## 2<sup>nd</sup>) The Centrality of Grace:

Grace pervades all of creation and is universally present. Grace is God's presence to create, heal, forgive, reconcile and transform human hearts, communities and the entire Creation.

Wherever God is present, there is grace! Grace brought creation into existence. Grace birthed human beings, bestowed on us the divine image, redeemed us in Jesus Christ and is ever transforming the whole creation into the realm of God's reign of compassion, justice, generosity and peace. # 3<sup>-1</sup>) Our Wesleyan tradition has a unique framework for understanding grace:

Prevenient: Drawn to the Father's loving Embrace.

Justifying: Jesus dying in my place. Sanctifying: The Spirit's strength to run the race. Glorification: God's love shines forever upon my face. In the coming weeks, we will explore Prevenient, Justifying and Sanctifying Grace as well as the Means of Grace.

# 4<sup>a</sup>) This understanding of Grace provides powerful direction for our ministry:

**Prevenient Grace:** God takes the initiative to reach us "where we are". We will take the initiative to love our neighbor and be a powerful force of good in our community.

Justifying Grace: Through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, we have been brought into relationship with Jesus. Our sins are forgiven! We are reconciled to God! We will share the Good News that God's love and forgiveness is available to all.

Sanctifying Grace: God invites us to a new way of doing life. We are part of a new community, we joyfully embrace a lifestyle of service, we are empowered by the Holy Spirit. It's all about LOVE!
