## The Goal of Love: Grow in Spiritual Maturity

until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ. We must no longer be children, tossed to and fro and blown about by every wind of doctrine by people's trickery, by their craftiness in deceitful scheming; but speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love.

Sad to say, there is a lot of confusing and deceitful 'teaching' being perpetuated today. Good teaching produces stability. Be careful who your spiritual teachers are. Carefully measure what you hear against the sweeping themes of the Bible and historic doctrines of the church. Let love be a primary litmus test. "The goal of what God is doing in the world is primarily relational." One great test of healthy teaching is to ask if it promotes love or division.

Ephesians 1-3: We are God's Beloved! Ephesians 4-6: Learn to live as God's Beloved! The Attitude of Love: Humility

I, therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love,

Humility and meekness were despised in the ancient world. Jesus exemplified humility and redefines greatness!

The humble person is secure in God's love and doesn't need to prove their worth to others. Be on the look out for ways that pride drives a wedge between you and others.

## The Perspective of Love: We are One!

making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace: there is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all.

"Make every effort" – Unity is a huge priority. It doesn't "just happen". It calls for effort. We don't 'create' unity. It's already given to us through Christ. Note all the common things we share as believers. In an age of division, it is crucial that we remember what unifies us. What can you do to strengthen the unity of the church?

## The Context of Love: Use our Abilities to Build Up One Another

But each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift. Therefore it is said, "When he ascended on high, he made captivity itself a captive; he gave gifts to his people." (When it says, "He ascended," what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is the same one who ascended far above all the heavens, so that he might fill all things.) He himself granted that some are apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ,

Every member of the Body of Christ has an important role! The word "pastor" is rarely used in the Bible. In this rare occurrence, do you see what the pastor's role is? What special abilities do you have to build up others? What can you do to develop and deploy this group?
