Sermon Notes

A Wonderful Summary of Core Christian Truth (5:1-2)

1 Follow God's example, therefore, as dearly loved children 2 and walk in the way of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

The Standard of Love: "Follow God's example"
The Security of Love: "as dearly loved children"
The Source of Love: "as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us"

Our New Ethic: Let go of things that choke out love (5:3-7)

3 But among you there must not be even a hint of sexual immorality, or of any kind of impurity, or of greed, because these are improper for God's holy people. 4 Nor should there be obscenity, foolish talk or coarse joking, which are out of place, but rather thanksgiving. 5 For of this you can be sure: No immoral, impure or greedy person—such a person is an idolater—has any inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God.

Humans are designed to worship. What we worship defines us. If we put anything at the core of our being besides God, we do harm to our souls. Love will not flourish where God has been evicted.

Our New Existence: Live in God's light (5:8-14)

8 For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light 9 (for the fruit of the light consists in all goodness, righteousness and truth) 10 and find out what pleases the Lord. 11 Have nothing to do with the fruitless deeds of darkness, but rather expose them.

Our New Energy: Live in the power of the Holy Spirit (5:15-20)

15 Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, 16 making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil. 17 Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the Lord's will is. 18 Do not get drunk on wine, which leads to debauchery. Instead, be filled with the Spirit, 19 speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit. Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord, 20 always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

We have a new purpose. Place your life continually under the influence of the Holy Spirit. Nurture Spirit-uality with fellowship, the Word, worship and gratitude.
