Sermon Notes

Rootedness & Fruitfulness *Luke 3 & 4*

As we look to the beginning of Jesus’ public ministry, we learn God’s abiding priorities for life and ministry. There are no shortcuts to effective ministry. We must be rooted deeply in the life of God and active in sharing His love. See John 15:4-5.

Live in the Father’s Love *Luke 3:21-22*

21 When all the people were being baptized, Jesus was baptized too. And as he was praying, heaven was opened **22** and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: “You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased.”

Live in Submission to the Father’s Will *Luke 4: 1-13*

5 The devil led him up to a high place and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. **6** And he said to him, “I will give you all their authority and splendor; it has been given to me, and I can give it to anyone I want to. **7** If you worship me, it will all be yours” . . . **8** Jesus answered, “It is written: ‘Worship the Lord your God and serve him only.’”

Minister in the Power of the Spirit *Luke 4:14*

14 Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news about him spread through the whole countryside.

Teach God’s Word *Luke 4:15*

15 He was teaching in their synagogues, and everyone praised him.

Set People Free from Oppression and Poverty *Luke 4:16-21*

18 “The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, **19** to proclaim the year of the Lord’s favor.”

Set People Free from Evil *Luke 4:31-37*

36 All the people were amazed and said to each other, “What words these are! With authority and power he gives orders to impure spirits and they come out!”

Set People Free from Disease *Luke 4:38-40*

40 At sunset, the people brought to Jesus all who had various kinds of sickness, and laying his hands on each one, he healed them.

Maintain the Balance of Spiritual Rootedness & Ministry Expansion *Luke 4:42-44*

42 At daybreak, Jesus went out to a solitary place. The people were looking for him and when they came to where he was, they tried to keep him from leaving them. **43** But he said, “I must proclaim the good news of the kingdom of God to the other towns also, because that is why I was sent.” **44** And he kept on preaching in the synagogues of Judea.
